Overview

I am an experienced Oracle DBA having worked with Oracle since 1992. I have worked in DBA teams within Financial, Local Government and Industrial Sectors and have worked with Oracle 6, 8 9i and 10g production installations in both Windows and UNIX environments, I also have several years experience with DB2 and MS SQL Server administration. and have undertaken formal training with both IBM and Oracle. Before 1988 I was an IMS DBA on IBM Mainframes prior to the introduction of Oracle and DB2. I have also, in more recent years, gained experience with the use of several lesser known PC and Mid Range Database products running under the UNIX and Windows Environments. I am familiar with data modelling using both IEF and Erwin and also the generation of physical databases environments from these products. My experience also includes the use of Oracle Enterprise Manager, RAC, RMAN, TOAD and SQL Navigator

I am currently on contract to Herefordshire Council where I am responsible for Oracle, SQL Server and Ingres Production Support placement. Prior to that I completed a contract assisting with the design and implementation of a 3 terabyte partitioned Oracle Database to support Track Analysis for Network Rail. Before then I spent 6 years on contract to Barclays and Barclaycard (working in the financial sector) - during which time I was responsible for the design, implementation and support of several major database environments involving both Oracle and DB2.

As a DBA my overall experience has been split around 50/50 between Design/Construction and Live Support roles. I have also been responsible, on a number of occasions, for providing training sessions for applications development staff, trainee DBA,s and end users at a number of sites.
